

# Indigenous Vascular Flora of the Hamilton Parklands, 1976-78

Surveys by A Arnold (Oct. 1976), R Bird (Nov. 1976; May, Nov. & Dec. 1978) and P Milne (Dec. 1977 & Oct. 1978), predominantly within the former fenced Old Reservoir paddock (the current Nature Trail is in this area). No recent formal survey of flora in the Eastern Barred Bandicoot enclosure, or outside, has been done.

Regeneration of Sheoak, Swamp Gum, Blackwood and some Black Wattle after grazing by cattle in the Old Reservoir ceased in Sept. 1979. Tall Spike-rush in the silt dam has also grown back.

Grazing with sheep ceased in the area outside the fenced Old Reservoir ceased in about 1976.

Various areas within the open northern grassland have been burned on a cycle from about 1990.

River Red Gums (a provenance trial) were planted in the western portion in 1980 by Department of Agriculture and other species were planted in the area west of the Old Reservoir in about 1985, organised by Alan Windust from the Lands Department.
