HFNC Excursion to Claude Austin State Forest on 21 September 1997

A good turn up of members and a mild, sunny spring day which was spent exploring a wonderful array of flowering plants at the Claude Austin 'Reserve'.

We were particularly impressed by the profuse display of Pink Bells (*Tetratheca ciliata*) and the range of heaths. The *Glossodia major* (Waxlips) also made a great show in a predominantly Yellow Box (*Eucalyptus melliodora*) woodland.

A few fungi were also identified: Orange Jelly Fungus (*Tremella mesenterica*) growing on a dead Silver Banksia (*Banksia marginata*), the Scarlet Bracket Fungus (*Pycnoporus coccineus*) again on a dead banksia, some little Yellow Belly Buttons (*Omphalina chromacea*) on algae on the ground. A single large bolete (*Boletus* sp.) with a reddish-brown cap was seen but not identified.
