## **Annual Program for 2023**

Our program of activities for the year are set out in the attached file.

## **Special Club Meeting on Thursday 16 March, 7.30 pm at HIRL.** Botanist **Trevor Whiffin** will address the meeting on the topic *Australian Tropical Rain Forest Plants*.

Australia, the "dry continent", has a small component of tropical rain forest. While originally seen as "alien" and intrusive, it is now recognised as being of international significance, integral to the development of tropical rain forests world-wide. Although occupying less than 1% of the land area of the continent, it is extremely rich and diverse, with more that 10% of the species of Australian plants.

Trevor has been studying the Australian tropical rain forest for some 50 years. With colleagues from CSIRO, he developed a computer-based key for the identification of Australian tropical rain forest plants. This was the first such key to any large group of plants.

Trevor will provide an overview of the plants of Australian tropical rain forests, with an emphasis on those plants that are of significance in both a national and an international botanical context. A focus will be on the "Wet Tropics" of north-east Queensland, where there is a concentration of important plants of great significance to the development of the general Australian flora. The primitive plants there are important in the evolution of tropical rain forest plants world-wide, as well as the primitive members of more typically Australian plants, such as eucalypts and heaths.

**Club Excursion** – <u>Saturday 18 March</u> to <u>Dry Creek Reserve</u> on the Lower Glenelg River. We leave the Hamilton Visitor Centre at 9.00 am and will proceed to **Nelson** where we will re-group and then leave for Dry Creek. Details may be found in the attachment provided by the leader, Steve Martinich.

**Next work activity** – <u>Sunday 26 March</u>, 10 am at the Wannon Flora Reserve. We meet on Powells Rd, on the west side of the reserve. The aim will be to pull up hundreds of very small Hedge Wattles that have germinated since the shrubs were removed from the outer edges of the reserve, on west and north sides. You should bring <u>leather gloves</u> to handle the spiney seedlings. You will be given a description of somewhat similar plants that you must avoid pulling up.
